

## Brag Statements

Brag statements should read in past tense in the following format: Subject (department or program), Past Tense Verb, Object of Brag (accomplished what), To What Degree (numerical/quantifiable).

Examples: "The Green Jackets completed a total of 1900 hours of service at UNT sponsored events." "Parents who attended Parent Orientation increased their knowledge of campus resources by an average of 3.1 points on a 5-point Likert scale."

Brag 1	Director gave 19 personal campus tours to veterans that resulted in all 19 veterans enrolling.
Brag 2	Student Veteran Services held two open houses this semester with around 30 hiring managers and 400 students attending.
Brag 3	Selected by Military Times 2017 "Best for VETS Colleges" 1st time. Selected by Victory Media for Military Friendly 2017 "MF Gold Tier 1 Research' Universities for GI Jobs 1st Time. Selected Top Colleges/Universities 2017 by Military Advance Education & Transition. Selected by Victory Media for Top STEM Colleges 2017. Director provided survey results
Brag 4	Student Veterans Asssocation dedicated two new plaques for veteran students on the 3rd floor, Union, Union Memorial Wall.
Brag 5	Continual Community Support for Denton County Veterans Day Program for the fourth year in a row.
