

Supreme Court Ruling 4/5

[The Student Government Association Supreme Court ruled tonight on the case of the appeal of Election Board Hearing 3.30 as filed by Roberto Navarro Jr and Steven Maldonado on March 31, 2017.

The Court ruled by a vote of 5-0 that the Navarro/Maldonado campaign was in violation of the Election Code during the Election Cookout on Wednesday, March 29, 2017.

The Court ruled by a vote of 5-0 that the Election Board failed to give due process to the Navarro/Maldonado campaign during the investigation resulting in the Election Board ruling on March 30, 2017, that disqualified the ticket from the SGA Presidential/Vice-Presidential elections.

The Court ruled that the Election Board Hearing 3.30 disqualification of the Navarro/Maldonado candidate team was unjust and unequal to the violation in question during Hearing 3.30. Subsequently, the Court ruled by a vote of 5-0 to redact the disqualification of the Navarro/Maldonado candidate team, and remove from calculation the votes accrued by the ticket for the event of the Election Cookout. This consequence was voted by the Court to fit the violation of the event.
